Subject	Literature
Grade Level	Primary School (10-11 years old)
Duration	1 hour and 30 minutes
Objective(s)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand the literary technique of characterization using the STEAL method (Speech, Thoughts, Effect on others, Actions, and Looks). • Apply the STEAL method to analyze characters in two fables: "The Hare and the Tortoise" and "The Fox and the Crow." • Use AI tools to enhance engagement and visualization through animated character portrayals.

Introduction to STEAL and the Stories (15 minutes) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Briefly explain the STEAL method of characterization. ○ Provide a quick overview of "The Hare and the Tortoise" and "The Fox and the Crow." 2. Reading and Initial STEAL Identification (20 minutes) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Read specific excerpts from the fables. ○ In a class discussion, identify examples of Speech, Thoughts, Effect on others, Actions, and Looks for each main character. 3. Group Activity: STEAL Chart and AI Animation (40 minutes) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Divide students into small groups to work on STEAL charts for each character. ○ Use Animaker to create brief character animations showing different aspects of STEAL. ○ Encourage students to use Character AI to chat with AI versions of the characters to gather further insights for their

<p>Pre-requisites</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Basic familiarity with using tablets or computers for educational activities. • Understanding of fables as short stories with moral lessons.
<p>Activities & Procedures</p>	<p>1. Introduction to STEAL and the Stories (15 minutes)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Explain the STEAL method for analyzing characters through Speech, Thoughts, Effect on others, Actions, and Looks. ○ Provide brief summaries of "The Hare and the Tortoise" and "The Fox and the Crow." <p>2. Reading and Initial STEAL Identification (20 minutes)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Read both fables aloud or watch a brief video version. ○ On the whiteboard, gather examples from students for each element of STEAL as they relate to the characters (e.g., The Hare's Speech showing his confidence or the Crow's Actions revealing her vanity). <p>3. Group Activity: STEAL Chart and AI Animation (40 minutes)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Divide the class into small groups, each assigned a character (e.g., Hare, Tortoise, Fox, Crow). ○ Students fill out a STEAL chart for their character using insights from Character AI to deepen understanding of Speech, Thoughts, and Actions. ○ Using Animaker, groups create short animations highlighting STEAL elements for their character, like the Hare boasting (Speech) or the Fox plotting (Thoughts and Actions). <p>4. Presentation and Reflection (15 minutes)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Groups present their STEAL charts and animations to the class.

Extensions/Modifications	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Apply the STEAL method to other fables or short stories.• For advanced students, use additional AI tools to create written dialogue or voice-overs for animations that enhance character depiction.
