Subject	Literature
Grade Level	Primary School (10-11 years old)
Duration	1 hour and 30 minutes
Objective(s)	<ul> <li>Understand the literary technique of characterization using the STEAL method (Speech, Thoughts, Effect on others, Actions, and Looks).</li> <li>Apply the STEAL method to analyze characters in two fables: "The Hare and the Tortoise" and "The Fox and the Crow."</li> <li>Use AI tools to enhance engagement and visualization through animated character portrayals.</li> </ul>

Structure	1. Introduction to STEAL and the Stories (15 minutes)

	2. Reading and Initial STEAL Identification (20 minutes)

	<ul> <li>In a class discussion, identify examples of Speech, Thoughts, Effect on others, Actions, and Looks for each main character.</li> </ul>
	3. Group Activity: STEAL Chart and AI Animation (40 minutes)
	<ul> <li>Divide students into small groups to work on STEAL charts for each character.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Use <u>Animaker</u> to create brief character animations showing different aspects of STEAL.</li> </ul>

3. Group Activity: STEAL Chart and Al Animation (40 minutes)	
<ul> <li>Divide the class into small groups, each assigned a chara (e.g., Hare, Tortoise, Fox, Crow).</li> </ul>	cter
<ul> <li>Students fill out a STEAL chart for their character using insights from Character AI to deepen understanding of Speech, Thoughts, and Actions.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Using <u>Animaker</u>, groups create short animations highlight STEAL elements for their character, like the Hare boastin (Speech) or the Fox plotting (Thoughts and Actions).</li> </ul>	-
