

Learning Scenario Template

Title	Art and Storytelling
Subject	English
Subject	Lighsh
Grade Level	A2 Level/ 11-year-old students
Duration	2 hours- 45 minutes
Objective(s)	 Collaboration: Students work in groups to analyze images and build a narrative together. Enhancement of Critical Thinking Skills: Students interpret visual details, connect them to form a cohesive story, and evaluate AI-generated visuals. Development of Writing Skills: Writing based on a visual stimulus, focusing on structure, vocabulary, and sentence construction. Creativity: Encouraging imaginative interpretations of both artwork and AI-generated images for storytelling.
Pedagogical Methods	Inquiry-based and Collaborative Learning
Structure	 Introduction: Brief discussion on storytelling, interpreting visual art, and AI-generated visuals. Group Observation: Students are divided into groups and provided with either famous paintings or DALL-E-generated images. Brainstorming: Each group completes a questionnaire to guide discussion and idea generation. Story Creation: Groups use brainstormed ideas to write a narrative based on their assigned image. Sharing: Groups share their stories, with visuals, to encourage speaking and listening skills.
Materials/Resources	 Printed copies of famous paintings or DALL-E-generated images for each group (e.g., Vermeer, Seurat paintings, or custom AI images). Questionnaire with prompts (sample questions below). Interactive Whiteboard for sharing images or collaborative notes. Computer or tablet to display DALL-E visuals or generate new



	ones based on students' story ideas.
Pre-requisites	Students should know:
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	• Story structure: Setting, characters, sequence, climax, and
	resolution.
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	• Basic descriptive language and connecting words for linear event linking.
Activities & Procedures	• Introduction (15 minutes): Briefly discuss storytelling elements,
	visual interpretation, and how AI-generated images like DALL-E can
	inspire stories.
	• Group Setup and Image Analysis (20 minutes): Each group is
	given a painting or DALL-E image to observe, discuss, and fill out the
	questionnaire.Questionnaire Guidance (10 minutes): Sample questions could
	include:
	Describe the people or objects in the image: What do they look
	like? What might they be doing?
	What do you think each person is feeling or thinking?Describe the setting: Where and when does this take place?
	 What events might happen before or after this scene?
	• Story Writing (45 minutes): Groups use their questionnaire
	responses to draft a story. Provide options for generating a second
	 DALL-E image as a "next scene" in their story. Class Sharing (15 minutes): Each group reads or presents their
	story, showing their AI-generated image on the whiteboard.
	• Reflection (10 minutes): Discuss how AI-generated visuals
	enhanced or influenced their storytelling and reflect on what they
	learned.
Assessment/Evaluation	Participation in group discussions.
	 Questionnaire Completion: Evaluate creativity and thoughtfulness
	of responses.
	• Story Structure and Content: Review for creativity, coherence,
	and proper story structure.
	• Class Sharing: Observe speaking skills, engagement, and ability to
	connect the story to the visual.
Extensions/Modifications	For Different Levels: Provide simpler paintings for less advanced
	groups or add complex questions for advanced students.
	• Individual Writing Option: For students who prefer, they can work
	individually to create shorter stories inspired by the painting.



• Post-Activity Reflection: Ask students to write individually about what they learned from the collaborative process.
Extensions/Modifications:
 For Different Levels: Provide simpler DALL-E-generated images for basic groups or add complex prompts for advanced learners. Individual Writing Option: Students can individually create shorter stories from DALL-E images, refining descriptive language skills. Post-Activity Reflection: Ask students to write individually about how the AI visuals shaped their story ideas and creative process.
 Consider background music or creating a quiet environment to help students focus during brainstorming and writing. Introduce students to AI concepts by discussing DALL-E and how it
interprets prompts to create visuals.
 Questionnaire template. Suggested paintings: "The Milkmaid" (Vermeer), "Starry Night" (Van Gogh), "The Persistence of Memory" (Dali), "Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte" (Seurat). DALL-E Tool Links and Resources: Examples or tutorials for generating educational visuals.
