

## Learning Scenario Template

Title	The Legacy of Influential English Women Authors
Subject	English Literature
Grade Level	High School / C1-C2 level 15-16 year -old students
Duration	2 class periods (approximately 90-100minutes)
Objective(s)	<ul> <li>Identify and understand the contributions of key English women authors, such as Jane Austen, Mary Shelley, Charlotte Brontë, Virginia Woolf, and George Eliot.</li> <li>Analyze how the social and cultural context influenced their writing and themes.</li> <li>Briefly explore the literary style of each author</li> </ul>
Pedagogical Methods	<ul> <li>Inquiry-based learning</li> <li>Group discussions</li> <li>Textual analysis</li> <li>Creative writing exercise</li> </ul>
Structure	<ol> <li>Introduction (10 minutes)         <ul> <li>Brief overview of the influence of English women authors on literature.</li> <li>Discussion on gender challenges in historical literary contexts.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Group Activity: Author Exploration (20 minutes)         <ul> <li>Divide students into groups, assigning each group an author.</li> <li>Groups research their assigned author's life, works, and</li> </ul> </li> </ol>

Class Presentations and Discussion (20 minutes) <ul> <li>Each group presents key insights.</li> <li>Facilitate a discussion on recurring themes and unique styles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>4. Textual Analysis Exercise (20 minutes) <ul> <li>Analyze excerpts from <i>Pride and Prejudice, Frankenstein,</i> and <i>To the Lighthouse</i>.</li> <li>Discuss literary techniques, narrative styles, and themes.</li> </ul> </li> <li>5. Creative Writing Assignment (20 minutes) <ul> <li>Students write a short piece inspired by the themes or style of one of the authors studied.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Materials/Resources	<ul> <li>Biographical and literary excerpts from each author's work.</li> <li>Access to literary analysis resources or handouts.</li> <li>Paper and digital tools for the creative writing exercise.</li> </ul>

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Pre-requisites	<ul> <li>Previous exposure to literary texts</li> <li>Familiarity with literary analysis concepts.</li> </ul>
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Activities & Procedures	1. <b>Introduction:</b> Provide historical context about the literary world these authors operated in.
	<ol> <li>Group Research Activity: Ask students to briefly explore biographical details, signature works, and the impact of these women on English literature.</li> </ol>
	3. <b>Presentations:</b> Groups share findings, followed by a class discussion on common themes and distinctive styles.
	4. <b>Textual Analysis Exercise:</b> Distribute excerpts for analysis and guide students through identifying themes and techniques.
	<ol> <li>Creative Writing: Encourage students to emulate the voice or themes of one of the studied authors</li> </ol>
Assessment/Evaluation	Participation in discussions.
	Quality of group presentations.
	<ul><li>Analysis accuracy during textual analysis.</li><li>Originality in the creation of a written text</li></ul>
Extensions/Modifications	<ul> <li>For advanced students, add a comparative essay on two authors.</li> <li>Allow modifications in assignment formats, such as multimedia presentations.</li> </ul>
	• More thorough analysis of certain literary terms such as : Irony, Foreshadowing, Narrative Voice, Gothic Imagery
Additional Notes	• Encourage students to consider the cultural limitations faced by these women and how it influenced their work.
	• Foster an environment where students feel free to express how each author's work resonates with contemporary issues.
